Dr. Wang is a tenured Associate Professor in Lymphoma & Myeloma at the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center. He obtained his M.D. from Shandong Medical University and his M.D. from Beijing University, Medical School. Dr. Wang completed his clinical training first as an intern at the University of Michigan Hospitals, Ann Arbor, MI and as a resident, then chief resident at Norwalk Hospital, Norwalk, CT, subsequently as a fellow in oncology and in hematology at the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center, Houston, TX. Dr. Wang is board certified in internal medicine and medical oncology. He has co-authored more than 80 publications, and has given annual oral presentations at the Annual Meetings for the American Society of Hematologists (ASH) and the American Society of Clinical Oncologists (ASCO) since 2005. His clinical interests are in the areas of lymphoma and multiple myeloma using novel therapies in the fight against hematological malignancies including non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, multiple myeloma and Waldenstrom's globulinemia (http://www.mdanderson.org/care_centers/lymphoma/display/cfm). He is the current Director of the Multiple Myeloma Tissue Bank at the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center.

Dr. Wang was a recipient of the Fogarty International Fellowship Award, National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, MD. Dr. Wang is a regularly invited national and international speaker in his field. He organized the Annual SINO-US Seminar Series on Clinical Oncology – East Meets West, Multidisciplinary Management of Lymphoproliferative Disorders, Beijing, P.R. China. He has sponsored the training of hematologists and oncologists from China and Spain in his clinic and research at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center.
