

Dr. Richard Xu, the founder of Queens-Long Island Oncology & Hematology, is an Oncology & Hematology specialist. Dr. Xu did his residency in internal medicine at Long Island Jewish Medical Center, the Albert Einstein College of Medicine after obtaining his Ph.D. Degree in Molecular Pharmacology at Dartmouth College, one of the Ivy League Colleges established 1769.
